Introduction Video

One Life Church, originally called Mudgee Christian Outreach Centre, was established in 1988 by Pastors Jack and Noeline Hurditch. They were assisted by Pastors Pierre and Dale Meyer-Gleaves, who were based in Lithgow at the time.

Originally meeting in the auditorium of Cudgegong Valley Public School, and later at a rented premise within the Bridge Complex at 160 Church Street, in 1995 the church took up a lease at our current location, and two years later purchased the property we all enjoy today. A few years later the church purchased a property in Kandos that functions as an annexe church to Mudgee with regular meetings being held there throughout the month. Over the next 20 years the church has been led by a committed team of Senior Pastors and Leaders Including Ps Greg & Teena Barnes, Ps Steve & Elizabeth McKenzie and Ps Brian & Dawn Ludlow who served over many years.

In 2017 Ps Ken & Rochelle Sauerbier transitioned into the role of Senior Pastors after both having served within the life of the church for 20 years. Over their time ministering the church has continued to see healthy growth. We are also supported locally by a Mid-Western network of INC Churches that is led by Ps Greg & Teena Barnes in Orange.

One Life Church is part of International Network of Churches (INC) formerly known as Christian Outreach Centre. We are part of a movement of churches that started in Australia in 1974 and has grown to become a network of churches spanning much of the world.

THE HEART OF A LEADER

The future success of any church is reliant on a raising of the next generation of leaders. At One Life, our heart is to identify, equip and empower our people for all God has called them to achieve in their lives & in their serving within the church.

Leaders have a heart to serve God and others, and they are enthusiastic about living with Godly vision and purpose.

- d) Are inspired to GO Leaders are passionate about living a life of leadership in the world as well as in the church.

GOVERNANCE AND FINANCE

OUR CHURCH GOVERNMENT

1 GUIDED BY PASTORAL & MINISTRY TEAM

The Pastors and Ministry teams are led by Ps Ken Sauerbier. The pastoral team oversees the day-to-day ministry and operations of the church. These staff pastors serve the congregation and are responsible for the development of people & teams across the church.

The Senior Pastor and our Ministry team carry the oversight for the Spiritual life of our church. The ministry team is made up of spiritually mature men and women who meet to pray and spiritually lead the church in our mission.

2 PROTECTED FINANCIALLY THROUGH OUR COMMITTEE OF MANAGEMENT (COM)

Our COM oversees the finances of our church and also directs the provision of the services needed by the church in fulfilling our vision, mission and values. They provide oversight regarding the major financial commitments of the church. The COM also aims to provide an important layer of accountability and integrity to the management of the churches assets and future acquisitions.

3 ASSISTED BY THE SUPPORT OF DEMOGRAPHIC LEADERS

Our demographic leaders serve in various areas of church life (e.g. creative team, youth, young adults, Kingdom Kids, Global Care Mudgee C.R.E.W. and others). These leaders are accountable to the pastoral team and empower those within their demographic areas.

4 STRENGTHENED BY THE INC MOVEMENT.

Our church is part of the International Network of Churches (INC) which has many churches around the world. INC Australia has a National Chairman and a National Executive Team who can be called upon to help in accountability matters relating to the Senior Pastor, if requested to do so by the Pastors or Committee of Management. This team serves as Apostolic elders and provides our local church with resources and accountability around finances, child safety, and governance. Formerly known as Christian Outreach Centre INC is a network of churches in Australia, Oceania and throughout the world. In Australia, INC has churches in 120 locations. Across the world, INC has a presence in many nations including the UK, USA, Across South America, Africa, Asia & Europe. It has an extensive reach. We live by the mandate "BORN FOR MORE".

FINANCES

Our heart is that we would always approach our giving with a heart of generosity.

⁶ Remember this—a farmer who plants only a few seeds will get a small crop. But the one who plants generously will get a generous crop. ⁷ You must each decide in your heart how much to give. And don't give reluctantly or in response to pressure. "For God loves a person who gives cheerfully." **2 Corinthians 9:6-7 NLT**

At One Life, we practice tithing (giving a tenth of our income) for the support of Christ's body, the church, as God commands. We recognise that giving 10% of our income is the Biblical standard for giving.

Even before the law was given through Moses we see Abraham offered a tithe before the King of Salem (Melchizedek).

"... Then Abram gave Melchizedek a tenth of all the goods he had recovered." Genesis 14:20 NLT

"Bring the whole tithe into the storehouse, that there may be food in my house. Test me in this," says the Lord Almighty, "and see if I will not throw open the floodgates of heaven and pour out so much blessing that there will not be room enough to store it." Malachi 3:10 NIV

Giving is one of the central themes in the Bible. Jesus talked more about this subject than Heaven, Hell, or prayer. To understand what it means to be a Christ-follower, we must also understand what it means to be a giver.

1 TITHE

The tithe, or "first fruits" of our work and income belong to God. We find this principle all through God's Word. Tithing, giving God the first 10% of our income to the local church, is the primary, practical way we acknowledge that God is first (see **Proverbs 3:9-10**).

2 OFFERINGS

An offering is giving over and above the tithe.

The Lord said to Moses, ² "Tell the Israelites to bring me an offering. You are to receive the offering for me from everyone whose heart prompts them to give" **Ex 25:1-2 NIV**

The giving of tithes and offerings is worship to Jesus and an expression of the relationship between the individual giver and the Lord. That is why we don't have people fill out pledge cards or make faith promises. Funds are not "income only," they are worship and are not considered to be a business transaction but an expression of gratitude toward God.

STATEMENT OF FAITH

INC - INTERNATIONAL NETWORK OF CHURCHES

HOLY BIBLE	The Holy Bible, and only the Bible, is the authoritative Word of God. It alone is the final authority in determining all doctrinal truths. In its original writing, it is inspired, infallible, and inerrant. 2 Timothy 3:16; 2 Peter 1:20-21; Proverbs 30:5; Romans 16:25-26
TRINITY	There is one God, eternally existent in three persons: Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. These three are coequal and co-eternal. 1 John 5:7; Genesis 1:26; Matthew 3:16-17, 28:19; Luke 1:35; Isaiah 9:6; Hebrews 3:7-11
JESUS CHRIST	Jesus Christ is God the Son, the second person of the Trinity. On earth, Jesus was 100% God and 100% man. He is the only man ever to have lived a sinless life. He was born of a virgin, performed miracles, died on the cross for mankind, and thus atoned for our sins through the shedding of His blood. He rose from the dead on the third day according to the Scriptures, ascended to the right hand of the Father, and will return again in power and glory. John 1:1,14, 20:28; 1 Timothy 3:16; Isaiah 9:6; Philippians 2:5-6; 1 Timothy 2:5
VIRGIN BIRTH	Jesus Christ was conceived by God the Father, through the Holy Spirit (the third person of the Trinity) in the virgin Mary's womb; therefore, He is the Son of God. Matthew 1:18, 25; Luke 1:35; Isaiah 7:14; Luke 1:27-35
REDEMPTION	Man was created good and upright, but by voluntary transgression he fell; his only hope of redemption is in Jesus Christ, the Son of God. Genesis 1:26-31, 3:1-7; Romans 5:12-21
REGENERATION	For anyone to know God, regeneration by the Holy Spirit is absolutely essential. John 6:44, 65; Matthew 19:28; Titus 3:5
SALVATION	We are saved by grace through faith in Jesus Christ: His death, burial, and resurrection. Salvation is a gift from God, not a result of our good works or of any human efforts. Ephesians 2:8-9; Galatians 2:16, 3:8; Titus 3:5; Romans 10:9-10; Acts 16:31; Hebrews 9:22

REPENTANCE

Repentance is the commitment to turn away from sin in every area of our lives and to follow Christ, which allows us to receive His redemption and to be regenerated by the Holy Spirit. Thus, through repentance we receive forgiveness of sins and appropriate salvation.

SANCTIFICATION

Sanctification is the ongoing process of yielding to God's Word and His Spirit in order to complete the development of Christ's character in us. It is through the present ministry of the Holy Spirit and the Word of God that the Christian is enabled to live a Godly life.

JESUS' BLOOD

The Blood that Jesus Christ shed on the Cross of Calvary was sinless and is 100% sufficient to cleanse mankind of all sin. Jesus allowed Himself to be punished for both our sinfulness and our sins, enabling all those who believe to be free from the penalty of sin, which is death.

JESUS CHRIST INDWELLS ALL BELIEVERS

Christians are people who have invited the Lord Jesus Christ to come and live inside them by His Holy Spirit. They relinquish the authority of their lives over to Him thus making Jesus the Lord of their life as well as Saviour. They put their trust in what Jesus accomplished for them when He died, was buried, and rose again from the dead.

BAPTISM IN THE HOLY SPIRIT

Given at Pentecost, it is the promise of the Father, sent by Jesus after His Ascension, to empower the Church to preach the Gospel throughout the whole earth.

THE GIFTS OF THE HOLY SPIRIT

The Holy Spirit is manifested through a variety of spiritual gifts to build and sanctify the church, demonstrate the validity of the resurrection, and confirm the power of the Gospel. The Bible's lists of these gifts are not necessarily exhaustive, and the gifts may occur in various combinations. All believers are commanded to earnestly desire the manifestation of the gifts in their lives. These gifts always operate in harmony with the Scriptures and should never be used in violation of Biblical parameters.

THE CHURCH

MARRIAGE:

Healing of the sick is illustrated in the life and ministry of Jesus and included in the commission of Jesus to His disciples. It is given as a sign, which is to follow believers. It is also a part of Jesus' work on the cross and one of the gifts of the Spirit.

KNOW GOD

EPHESIANS 4:14-16 NLT

HOW CAN I GET MORE FROM MY BIBLE?

1. I MUST ACCEPT ITS AUTHORITY

Your attitude toward the Bible makes a huge difference.

We believe in the closed canon of scripture:

- There are not, nor will there ever be, any other books, verses or ideas added to the Bible or
 placed beside it as equal in authority or revelation.
- All preaching, teaching, prophesying or any other communication being declared in the name of the Lord is to be subject to measurement by the content of the Word of God.

HABIT 1: BIBLE STUDY

2. I MUST ASSIMILATE ITS TRUTHS. - PSALM 19:7-11

- Hearing God's Word. "Faith comes by hearing the word of God." Romans 10:17
- Receiving God's Word with an open heart. 1 Thessalonians 2:13

3. WE MUST APPLY AND ACTION THE WORD

But be doers of the Word [obey the message], and not merely listeners to it, betraying yourselves [into deception by reasoning contrary to the Truth]. ²³For if anyone only listens to the Word without obeying it and being a doer of it, he is like a man who looks carefully at his [own] natural face in a mirror; ²⁴For he thoughtfully observes himself, and then goes off and promptly forgets what he was like. ²⁵But he who looks carefully into the faultless law, the [law] of liberty, and is faithful to it and perseveres in looking into it, being not a heedless listener who forgets but an active doer [who obeys], he shall be blessed in his doing (his life of obedience). **James 1:22-25 AMPC**

Prayer is two-way communication with the Lord. One of the primary reasons we pray is to build a personal relationship with God through prayer.

FASTING

Seasons of prayer & fasting personally and corporately are also important habits to develop in our spiritual growth. Some great examples are Esther 4:16, Nehemiah 1:4, Luke 2:37, Acts 13:2.

HABIT 3: SHARING YOUR FAITH

One of Jesus' last instructions to his disciples is known as 'The Great Commission'. It is important that we don't keep our faith to ourselves, but that we fulfill Jesus' commission to be a constant witness to those around us - with our words, and by our actions. As we overcome the fear of man in sharing our faith, it gives us boldness to continue to pursue the things of God.

Congratulations on discovering your spiritual gifts! God uniquely created you and gave you these gifts for a reason. Now that you've identified how He has gifted you, your next step is to learn how you can use those gifts for the purpose He has for you.

On the following pages, you can learn about your spiritual gifts and find out more about the available areas to serve at One Life Church where you can best use your gifts.

A. ADMINISTRATION	The gift of administration is the divine strength or ability to organise, direct, and implement plans to lead others in the various ministries of the Church. Luke 14:28-30; Acts 6:1-7; 1 Corinthians 12:28
B. APOSTLESHIP	The gift of apostleship is the divine strength or ability to pioneer new churches and ministries through planting, overseeing, and training. Acts 15:22-35; 1 Corinthians 12:28; 2 Corinthians 12:12; Galatians 2:7-10; Ephesians 4:11-14
C. CRAFTSMANSHIP	The gift of craftsmanship is the divine strength or ability to plan, build and work with your hands in construction environments to accomplish multiple ministry applications. Exodus 30:22, 31:3-11; 2 Chronicles 34:9-13; Acts 18:2-3
D. DISCERNMENT	The gift of discernment is the divine strength or ability to spiritually identify falsehood and to distinguish between right and wrong motives and situations. The spiritual gift of discernment is also known as the gift of "discernment of spirits" or "distinguishing between spirits." Matthew 16:21-23; Acts 5:1-11, 16:16-18; 1 Corinthians 12:10; Hebrews 5:14; 1 John 4:1-6
E. EVANGELISM	The gift of evangelism is the divine strength or ability to clearly and effectively communicate the Gospel of Jesus Christ to people who are within or beyond your natural sphere of influence and leading them to the saving knowledge of Jesus Christ. Acts 8:5-6, 8:26-40, 14:21, 21:8; Ephesians 4:11-14; 2 Timothy 4:5

F. EXHORTATION	The gift of exhortation is the divine strength or ability to encourage others through the written or spoken word and Biblical truth. Acts 14:22; Romans 12:8; 1 Timothy 4:13; Hebrews 10:24-25
G. FAITH	The gift of faith is the divine strength or ability to believe God for unseen supernatural results in time of special crisis or opportunity in such mighty power that they are lifted right of the realm of even natural or ordinary faith in God – and have a divine certainty put within their souls that triumphs over everything. Acts 11:22-24; Romans 4:18-21; 1 Corinthians 12:9; Hebrews 11
H. GIVING	The gift of giving is the divine strength or ability to meet the various needs of the church and its ministries, missionaries, or of people who do not have the means to provide fully for themselves. The goal is to encourage and provide, giving all credit to God's love and provision. Mark 12:41-44; Romans 12:8; 2 Corinthians 8:1-7, 9:2-7
I. HEALING	The gifts of healing is the divine strength or ability to act as an intermediary in faith, prayer, and by the laying-on of hands for the healing of physical and mental illnesses. It is the miraculous ability to use God's healing power to restore a person who is sick, injured, or suffering. Acts 3:1-10, 9:32-35, 28:7-10; 1 Corinthians 12:9, 28
J. HELPS	The gift of helps is the divine strength or ability to work in a supportive role for the accomplishment of tasks in Christian ministry. It is always having the desire and ability to help others, to do whatever it takes to get a task accomplished. Mark 15:40-41; Acts 9:36; Romans 16:1-2; 1 Corinthians 12:28

The gift of hospitality is the divine strength or ability to create warm, welcoming

environments for others in places such as your home, office, or church.

Acts 16:14-15; Romans 12:13, 16:23; Hebrews 13:1-2; 1 Peter 4:9

K. HOSPITALITY

L. INTERCESSION

The gift of intercession is the divine strength or ability to stand in the gap in prayer for someone, something, or someplace believing for profound results.

Hebrews 7:25; Colossians 1:9-12, 1 Timothy. 2:1-2

M. KNOWLEDGE

The gift of a Word of knowledge is the divine strength or ability to understand and to bring to light the principle of doctrine that form a basis for the action. This gift may bring scriptural truth to the attention of the church, or it may reveal facts that are needed for further action.

Acts 5:1-11; 1 Corinthians 12:8; Colossians 2:2-3

N. LEADERSHIP

The gift of leadership is the divine strength or ability to influence and care for God's people and lead them into deeper relationship with Christ and each other. They base their success on how well they help others succeed and grow in their spiritual walk with Jesus. They are able to accomplish many different tasks and objectives as they lead, but they will always lead relationally and with a deep concern for the well-being of others. They are "visionary" and less concerned with mundane details than those with the spiritual gift of administration. Many are entrepreneurial and willing to take risks to see the kingdom of God advanced through the church. They will go to great lengths to protect those under their care and are well-equipped to lead through crisis situations.

Romans 12:8; 1 Timothy 3:1-13, 5:17; Hebrews 13:17

O. MERCY

The gift of mercy is the divine strength or ability to feel empathy and to love and assist those who are suffering, and walk with them until their burden is lifted. The gift of mercy is founded in God's mercy towards us as sinners and is consistently expressed with measurable compassion.

Matthew 9:35-36; Mark 9:41; Romans 12:8; 1 Thessalonians. 5:14

P. MIRACLES

The gift of the working of miracles is the divine strength or ability to alter the natural outcomes of life in a supernatural way to reveal the presence and glory of God among His people and to create a sense of awe and wonder and Godly fear. God does not manifest His power just to cause wonderment; He always signifies or teaches something with His Miracles Though there were many enemies of the church, often the result of miracles being performed was more people coming to faith in Jesus and glorifying God, as well as greater faith and boldness within the church

Acts 9:36-42, 19:11-12, 20:7-12; Romans 15:18-19; 1 Corinthians 12:10, 28

Q. MISSIONARY

The missionary gift is the divine strength or ability to be sent to reach others inside or outside of your culture and nationality, while in most cases living in that culture or nation.

Acts 8:4, 13:2-3, 22:21; Romans 10:15

R. MUSIC/WORSHIP

The gift of music/worship is the divine strength or ability to sing, dance, or play an instrument primarily as a ministry unto the Lord. As a result of the passion and love displayed the congregation is led into worship of God.

Deuteronomy 31:22; 1 Samuel 16:16; 1 Chronicles 16:41-42;

2 Chronicles 5:12-13, 34:12; Psalm 150

S. PASTOR/ SHEPHERD

The gift of pastor/shepherd is the divine strength or ability (called and gifted) to care for the spiritual well-being of a local body of God's people. Pastors are first and foremost servants. They are servants of God and servants of His bride, the church. They are given a mixture of abilities by grace that allows them to serve the needs of an entire community.

John 10:1-18; Ephesians 4:11-14; 1 Timothy 3:1-7; 1 Peter 5:1-3

T. PROPHECY

The gift of prophecy is the divine strength or ability to receive a divinely inspired message and boldly speak it to others in the church. These messages can take the form of exhortation, correction, disclosure of secret sins, prediction of future events, comfort, inspiration, or other revelations given to equip and edify the body of Christ (1 Corinthians 14:3-4, 24-25). Again, they do not constitute the authoritative Word of God, but are the human interpretation of the revelation that was received. They are spoken in human words through a human mind which is why they must be tested against the Scriptures (1 Thessalonians 5:20-21).

Acts 2:37-40, 7:51-53, 26:24-29; 1 Corinthians 14:1-4; 1 Thessalonians 1:5

U. SERVICE

The gift of serving is the divine strength or ability to fill the many gaps of ministry and meet the needs of the church as it fulfills the Great Commission. The goal is to energize the church and free up others to use their gifts to the fullest. The result is the continued edification of the church and the added ability to see beyond its own needs and reach out into the community.

Acts 6:1-7; Romans 12:7; Galatians 6:10; 1 Timothy 1:16-18; Titus 3:14

The gift of teaching is the divine strength or ability to study and learn from the Scriptures to help the church fulfil her ministry as "a pillar and buttress of the truth" (1 Timothy 3:15). A teacher desires to follow in the footsteps of Jesus who taught in the synagogues and in the Temple as well as anywhere the people were gathered. They are called to demonstrate God's V. TEACHING love while revealing His truth to the world without fear. The effect of their ministry is the upholding of God's Word and the growth and maturity of His Bride until the day of His return. Acts 18:24-28, 20:20-21; 1 Corinthians 12:28; Ephesians 4:11-14 The gift of tongues is the divine strength or ability to pray in a heavenly language to encourage your spirit and to commune with God. It is the evidence of being Baptised with W. TONGUES the Holy Spirit. Romans 8:26; 1 Corinthians 14:15; Ephesians 5:18; Jude 1: 20 The gift of tongues is the divine strength or ability to pray in a heavenly language to encourage your spirit and to commune with God. It is the evidence of being Baptised with W. TONGUES the Holy Spirit. Romans 8:26; 1 Corinthians 14:15; Ephesians 5:18; Jude 1: 20 The gift of tongues in the church is the divine strength or ability to speak out in an unknown earthly or heavenly language to the church, delivering a message of exhortation, comfort, X. Acts 2:1-13; 1 Corinthians 12:10, 14:1-14 The gift of wisdom is the divine strength or ability to apply the truths of Scripture in a practical way, producing a fruitful outcome and the character of Jesus Christ. Wisdom doesn't end with knowledge, but is expressed in transformed hearts and lives. A person operating in Y. WISDOM

the gift can easily recognize where a decision or action may lead and can warn against those that may be harmful or unfruitful. They can often see through the confusion of a situation and can give direction that would help an individual or group obtain a God-glorifying goal.
